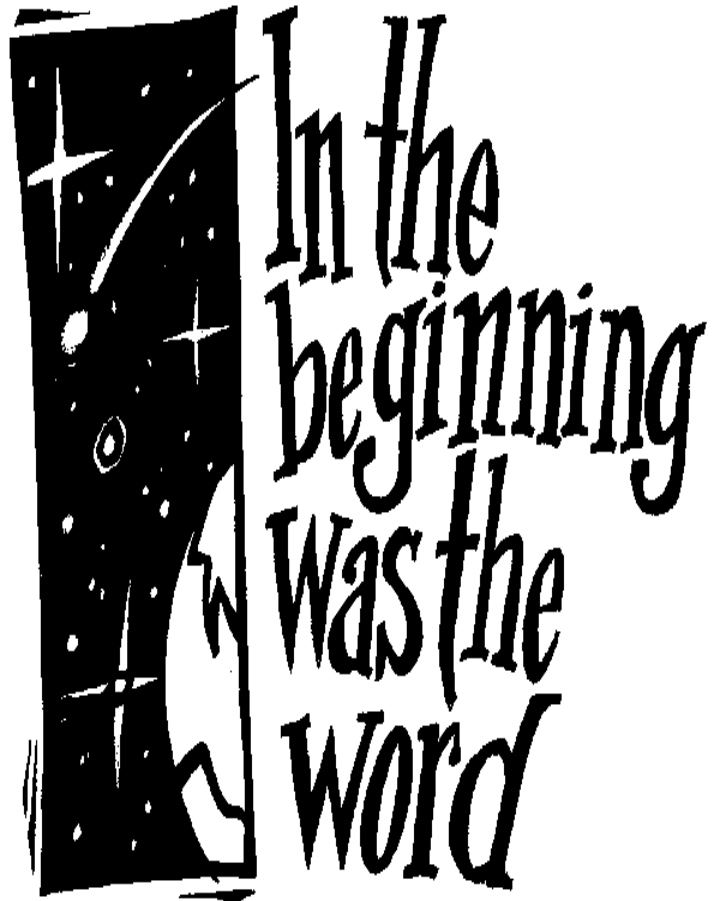

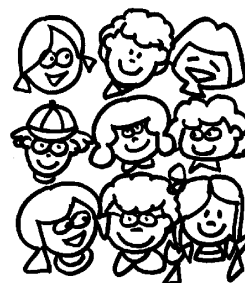

The Greening Committee has scheduled a free church energy audit for Friday, February 27th. The energy audit will identify ways in which Zion can improve energy efficiency and cut back waste. Results of the audit will be reported to the congregation.

Energy audits are a great idea not just for churches but for our homes too. If you're a National Grid or NStar Electric customer you can schedule your own free home energy audit by calling MassSave at 1-800-632-8300. Audits will take at least an hour and a half and you will need a recent electric bill and an estimate of your yearly oil usage if you use it for heating. 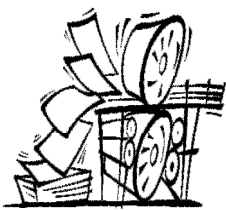
