HOLY LISTENING

I write this newsletter article on the first evening of the annual bishop's convocation – a time of learning and fellowship for all the pastors and other rostered leaders in the synod. In her address to us after dinner, Bishop Payne spoke to us of Listening. Our synod has been engaged in a five-year process of learning to listen more deeply – to God, to each other, to the world. As Bishop Payne reminded us, listening, really listening, is not easy. It is hard work; because we do not seek a normal, day-to-day kind of listening, but a Holy Listening. A Holy Listening is one in which we listen deeply for what God has to say to us, through scripture, in prayer, and through others. We need to cultivate the ability to engage in this kind of listening by making space for it in our lives. Daily prayer, Scripture reading, and regular worship help form senses to hear what God is saying to us.

We do not engage in this Holy Listening just as individuals by ourselves, but as a whole community of believers. As part of your process to call me as a new pastor, you participated in Holy Listening as you sought to understand what God is calling Zion Lutheran to do together as a people of God in Oxford. This kind of Holy Listening is never over, as a congregation we need to continue to be Holy Listeners together, listening for the Word among us – as God challenges, comforts and guides us through the days ahead.

Listen! Listen God is calling.

Through the Word inviting.

Offering forgiveness, comfort and joy.


SEMI-ANNUAL CONGREGATIONAL MEETING

ZION SOLAR ELECTRIC PROPOSAL



Our Property Chair, Jim Champoux, has been investigating a solar electric system for Zion. Jim recently had a solar electric system installed at his home through SolarCity using their \$0 Down Lease Option. Jim had gotten the Council's approval to get a proposal from SolarCity for Zion during the summer. Since then, Jim has been working to inform the Council about the Proposal from SolarCity as well as investigate funding options for the project. At the Council meeting on Oct 11th, Jim got the approval of the Council to make a presentation to the Congregation at the Congregational Meeting on November 20th.

In the coming weeks, Jim will be providing information about SolarCity, their proposal, and also New Generation Energy which is an organization that helps with fundraising endeavors for these types of projects. The proposal calls for an 8.28 kW system to be installed on the roof of Zion (the large, sloped roof facing the parking lot). This system would produce 9,300 kWh annually and offset 93% of our annual electricity. SolarCity takes care of all the necessary planning, permits and installation – and all of those costs are reflected upfront in the Proposal.

These systems work by being tied into the Electricity Grid and the solar electricity that is produced is either used at the church or goes back to the grid to be used elsewhere. Any solar energy used at the church would therefore not need to be purchased from National Grid. Any extra solar electricity generated would result in a credit on our monthly bill. And if we happen to need electricity when solar was not available, then we continue to take it from the grid and get charged for it. The result is called Net Metering. We produce / use the solar generated electricity at a lower cost than available from National Grid, make a positive impact on the community and environment around us, and also provide a positive influence to other people and organizations in the community to take the same initiative.

Unlike a residential system, Zion would be using the Pre-Paid Lease plan. This lease plan offers many advantages over purchasing a similar system – the cost is much less, SolarCity monitors and warranties the system and will make any repairs necessary for the full 20 years of the lease. At the end of the 20 year lease term, the lease can be extended, the system upgraded, or the system removed. The Pre-Paid lease would mean that the full cost of the lease (20 years) would be paid upfront and there would be no monthly payments. Essentially, we would eliminate 93% of our annual electricity cost for 20 years.

So, what does a system like this cost and how is Zion going to pay for it? The cost of the system for Zion based on the Proposal Jim received over the summer is \$14,088. The projected savings from installing and implementing the system is \$40,504! This is based on the difference in the cost of leasing the system vs the cost of buying electricity and the almost certain rising costs associated with electricity from the Grid over those 20 years.

But how are we going to pay for it? Jim has investigated a few options and has found an organization called New Generation Energy. New Generation Energy is an organization that helps other organizations with fund raising for environmentally friendly projects like the SolarCity proposal. They would work with us to help promote our project and raise the funds to pay for it. Donations would be made not just by members of Zion but others in the community and surrounding area. They even have special opportunities for matching donations. They would work with us to raise the funds and once we achieve our goal the funds would be given to us to pay for the project.

So the opportunity exists to work with New Generation Energy and raise the entire amount needed to install and implement the SolarCity proposal. That would result in not only an a tremendous positive environmental impact, but also in a large potential cost savings for Zion where funds we used to spend for electricity could be available for other projects. And by being a forerunner in our area, we have the added potential to influence other organizations and home owners to take the same steps.

We realize this is a major decision, with lots of questions. In the coming weeks, Jim will be providing information about SolarCity, New Generation Energy and some feedback from other organizations that have used both of these and have offered their feedback and recommendations. Here's some interesting statistics I found regarding the 10 Commandments – as well as a fun little computer game/quiz to help you practice. Try it – can you beat your kids?

14% of Americans can accurately name all Ten Commandments, yet 25% could name all seven ingredients of a well known hamburger.

"Thou shalt not kill," was known to fewer than six in ten Americans.

Less than half (45%) can recall the Commandment to "Honor thy father and mother."

Two of the least recalled names from a very well known family TV show (43%), were more familiar to Americans than the least recalled Commandments, "Remember the Sabbath" (34%) and "Do not make any false idols" (29%).

Even those who attend a place of worship at least once a week have trouble naming all Ten Commandments. "Thou shalt not kill" (70%) and "Thou shalt not steal" (69%).

CELEBRATING OXFORD'S 300TH ANNIVERSARY

Oxford will celebrate its 300th Anniversary of formal incorporation as a town in July 2013. Beginning in July 2012 the town plans to commemorate its long history and celebrate community life with a variety of events.. The Oxford Historical Commission has extended an invitation to the leadership of each church congregation to participate in this celebration . Everyone is invited however it is requested that each church designate one or two members as representatives. There have been two meetings to date one on May 18th and another on September 26th both to "brainstorm" and explore ways in which members of Houses of Worship in Oxford might come together to celebrate their presence. Some churches have been a part of Oxford's history longer than others and yet each congregation, in its own way, has had a strong influence on the spiritual and social life of this town. Each structure has its own history; each denomination has its own faith tradition.

Some of the suggested activities have been: a day of touring each of our Houses of Worship, an Ecumenical Choir concert, Organ concerts, bell/chime concert. We have also been ask to give the Historical Commission a written history of our church (which has been done). There is a plan to develop a booklet summarizing the histories of each church to commemorate this Anniversary.

It is also possible the we could participate in the parades by walking behind a banner or do a float or take a booth on Main St as part of the July 8, 2012 and July, 2013.

There will be a slide presentation of the 250th Anniversary Celebration on Thursday, November 10th at 6:30pm in the Oxford Senior Center. Roger Bacon will show slides taken by William Taft of those parades and activities. This presentation is sponsored by the Historical Commission and the Huguenot Memorial Society of Oxford, Inc.

We took in \$9,969 thousand in September and we spent \$8,275 thousand in September.

Income exceeded expenses by \$1,694 dollars-- resulting in a profit for September

For the year, we took in \$92,506 thousand and spent \$81,280 thousand through the month of September. For the year, income exceeded expenses by \$11,226 thousand.

For the 9 months of 2011, income is \$28,352 under budget and expenses are \$39,577.35 under budget.
