But for some, summer is a difficult time. School children who rely on subsidized meals at school are especially hungry this time of year. The Food Shelf in Oxford offers additional support to families during the non-school months. Other towns have similar support systems.

During the month of July, Zion is committed to provide support at the weekly distribution of food at the Oxford Food Shelf on Thursday evenings. That means there are five opportunities for YOU TO HELP by volunteering your time. (July 3, 10, 17, 24, and 31) There will be a sign-up sheet in the narthex, please consider helping out for at least a few of those weeks. We will also continue our year-round collections of donations in the basket that sits in the narthex of the church. Why do we do so much to raise awareness about hunger?

visit the sick and visit those imprisoned in body, mind or spirit

....we serve God.

We are in the midst of God, feeding God and our neighbor as God feeds us. This is the circle of giving. We always receive when we give. And in that moment, both of you will be fed abundantly.

After both services**



We have been graced with a beautiful setting for our church building, with lawn, the wooded outdoor chapel and memorial garden, and flowers and shrubs which surround the building and parking lot. This beauty all takes some tending; your efforts to help out are welcomed! If you can spare an hour or two to mow the lawn, weed dandelions, or tend to the plants – please come by whenever it works for you and do your part to help keep our outdoor space looking beautiful.



CONGREGATIONAL RETREAT

Join us on a summer weekend all ages congregational retreat to Camp Calumet, (www.calumet.org) on the shores of Lake Ossipee, NH, **Friday, June 27 through Sunday, June 29th**.

There's lots of things to enjoy at camp; Swimming, boating, Bible Study, hiking, hanging out together, singing around the campfire, worship in the Outdoor Chapel and lots of great food.

Conference Center or Village cabin: \$144 adult, \$77 student (up to age 18), 6 and under free, \$455 per family (living in same household)

Camp site: Camp sites include water and electricity and can accommodate tents, pop-up campers, trailers and RVs. Camp site fee is \$96 + additional fee for meals and program. Please check directly with Pastor Nancy to calculate total campsite cost. (It is usually less than the conference center/ village cabin cost, depending on number of children.) Very large RVs require special reservations, but can be accommodated.

Accommodations are available on a first come, first served, basis. The **\$50.00** per person **deposit to reserve your spot is needed now**. Make checks payable to Zion, clearly marked Calumet Retreat, with reservation request type noted.

Our recent collection of item for personal care kits for the Lutheran World Relief Ingathering concluded on May 5. Toiletries were packaged into towel rolls and boxed for delivery to Plymouth Church in Framingham. Thirty one kits were given. Leftover and single units that were not packaged will be given to the collection for refugees, survivors of human trafficking and asylum seekers at the annual synod meeting in June and/or the Oxford Ecumenical Food Shelf.

Information regarding our second year's commitment to the ELCA malaria drive was published in the April newsletter. The visual reminder of this commitment, a malaria net, was hung at the back of the sanctuary. When contributions are given, mosquitos are pinned to the outside of the net, symbolizing our goal of eradicating this totally preventable disease. A brief video highlighting this ELCA initiative was shared with the congregation at both services during the month long campaign.

The chocolate Easter crosses with messages of concern and hope are gone! Our members were encouraged to deliver them to family members and friends who have been unable to worship with us recently.

Please refer to the monthly posters and the weekly bulletins for items sought by the Oxford Ecumenical Food Pantry to feed the hungry. Thank you to everyone for your continuing generosity and commitment to our neighbors.

During the month of April, we received \$14,373.32 thousand and we disbursed \$12,693.33 thousand. Income exceeded Expenses by \$1679.99 dollars.

For the year, we received in \$48,916.54 thousand and disbursed \$48,709.42 thousand through the month of April. For the year, Income exceeded Expenses by \$207.37.

For the four months of 2014, Revenue is \$838.88 under budget and Expenses are \$1,045.25 under budget.
