PRAYING WITH GOD

I have been remembering a wonderful, meditative book on the life of a Christian that I read a few years ago. Soul Feast: An Invitation to the Christian Spiritual Life, by Marjorie J. Thompson, (WJK press, 1995). In her book, Thompson gives gentle advice on how to nurture a faithful Christian spirituality amidst the hustle and bustle of contemporary life.

In the chapter on prayer, she calls personal prayer "Communication and Communion with God." ... "Prayer," she says, "is the essential expression of" our relationship with God. "It is initiated by God. No matter what we think about the origin of our prayers, they are all a response to the hidden workings of the Spirit within."

Or to put it another way: our prayers to God begin in God. What a beautiful thought. God so desires to be in communion with us – to be in communication with us – that God stirs in us the impulse, the desire, the need to pray.

We often approach prayer as our list of needs and desires – we pray for ourselves, loved ones, our neighbors, the world. We talk to God. We tell God our side of the story. But Thompson reminds us that conversation is always a two-way street. We stop and listen to what our partner in conversation has to say. Prayer is not just about us talking, but is also about our listening. Listening to God's response to our needs. Listening to God's words to us. Listening to God's will for us.

When we pray, then, let us begin with silence, with an opening of our minds and hearts to first hear God's word, and then let us share our concerns, our heart's desire, our thanksgiving, our praise with God – our true conversation partner – and then listen once more, deeply, to hear again the voice of God.

Stir up your word in us, dear God; open our ears and calm our minds that we might hear you speak in and through our lives. Amen

In the wake of an earthquake, or having fled from violence as their homes were overtaken, they clasp a towel from a faraway place, with a bar of soap, a toothbrush...and washing up, they know that they have not been forsaken by the world.


The very simple gesture of giving a Personal Care Kit can give someone the encouragement to start anew, starting with a bath. We can share God's grace and love by providing that simple comfort.

This summer we will collect the items for the kits, then in the early fall, we will assemble the kits together and send them off to LWR.

Each kit contains the following items – you can donate individual items – or a full kit.

- One light-weight bath-size towel (maximum 52" X 27"), dark color recommended
- Two bath-size bars (4 to 5 oz.) of soap, any brand, in original wrapping
- One adult-size toothbrush in its original packaging
- One sturdy comb
- One metal nail clippers (attached file optional)

Financial Donations are also needed as it costs Lutheran World Relief **\$2.65 per kit** to ship these items overseas. After much prayer and preparation "What Makes God's House a Home?", a course based on the book "Reopening the Back Door" by Kenneth Haugk, Founder of Stephen Ministry was held at Zion on May 4th and 5th. This course was sponsored by the Evangelism Committee and led by Pat Bean. There were 14 participants and our Council and various committees were well represented. We discovered that what makes God's House a Home is LOVE and that we have been called to love one another. We learned a lot about the importance of reaching out to our inactive and active members. A very important focus of the material was that it is process oriented rather than results oriented. In other words our actions are to be centered in developing a relationship of caring, but not trying to control the results. Instead we leave the results to God.

We looked at the importance of attitudes, did a lot of role playing and discussed many ideas such as common mistakes to avoid, the importance of sensitivity and understanding, breaking the ice and getting past hello, facing defensiveness and criticisms and dealing with hurt and anger. We worshipped together, ate together, learned a lot, got to know each other a little better and we had fun doing it.

Thanks go to Pat Bean for her tireless effort in making this such a success, to Pastor Nancy for leading us as we gathered for worship, to the Memorial Committee for agreeing to help with the funding, to the members of the Evangelism Committee for preparing meals, setting up and taking care of the cleanup following the weekend and to all who took the time to participate.

This meeting ended with prayer at 9:10 PM.



Come celebrate summer and meet new & old friends at Camp Calumet! Come for the day or better yet, come for the entire weekend!






2012-2013 LIPY PLANNING
